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Preface

Republic Act No. 9710 or the Magna Carta of Women is “a comprehensive women’s human rights law that seeks to eliminate discrimination against women by recognizing, protecting, fulfilling and promoting the rights of women, especially those in the marginalized sectors.” The provision included in the law states:

(c) Generation and Maintenance of GAD Database. All departments, including their attached agencies, offices, bureaus, state universities and colleges, government-owned and -controlled corporations, local government units, and other government instrumentalities shall develop and maintain a GAD database containing gender statistics and sex-disaggregated data that have been systematically gathered, regularly updated; and subjected to gender analysis for planning, programming, and policy formulation.

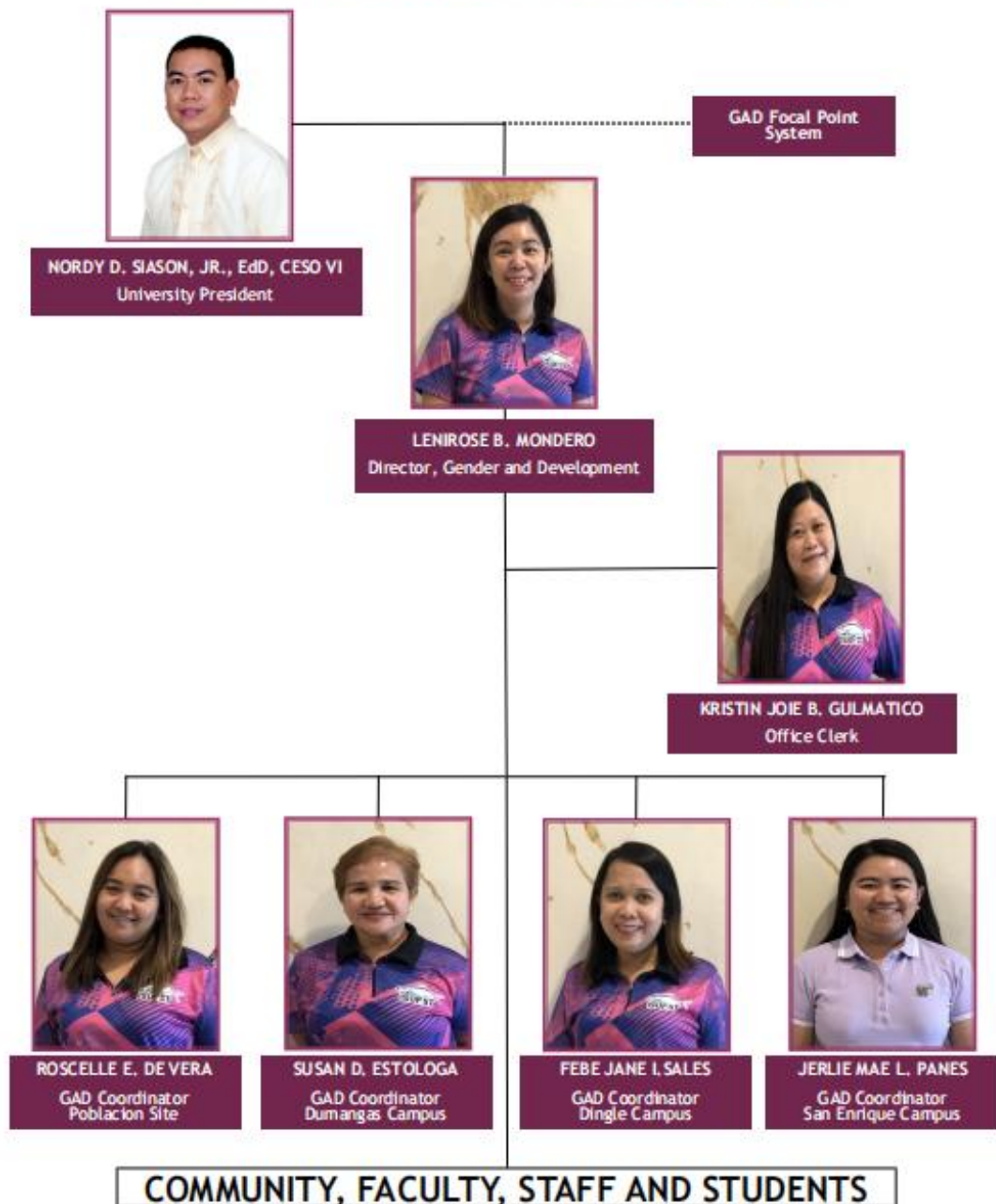

This practice provides valuable insights into the experiences and outcomes of male and female students within educational institutions. By examining these data, we can identify disparities, assess the effectiveness of gender-responsive policies, and inform evidence-based decision-making to promote gender equality.

ISUFST GENDER AND DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

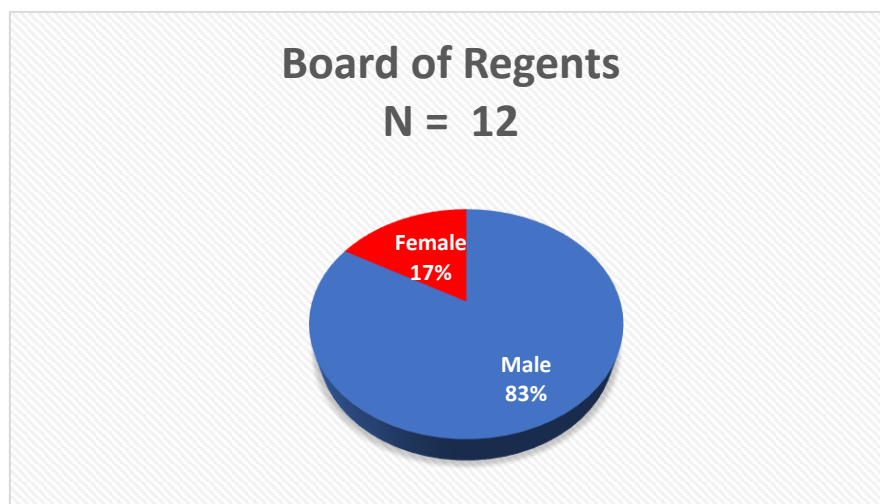

Board of Regents

The Board of Regents (BOR) is the governing body of ISUFST. The BOR has 12 members coming from both the University and the private and public sectors. At present, 10 are men (83%) and 2 are women (17%).

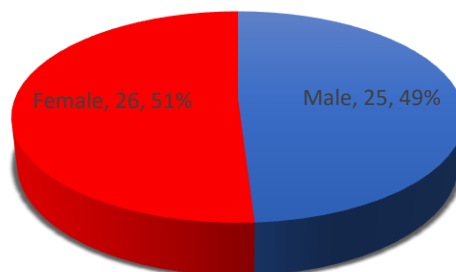


ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL

The Administrative Council consist of the president of the university as Chairman, the vice presidents, deans, directors and other officials of equal rank as members, and whose duty is to review and recommend to the Board of Regents policies governing the administration, management and development planning of the university or college for appropriate action. Of the 51 members of the Council, 26 are females (51%) and 25 are males (49%).

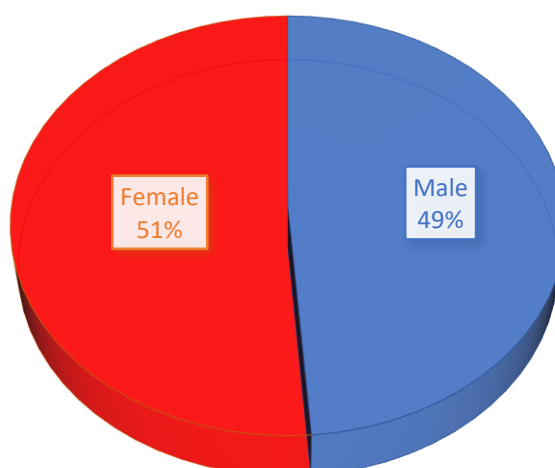


ACADEMIC COUNCIL

The Academic Council is composed of the president of the university as Chairman and all members of the instructional staff with the rank of not lower than assistant professor as members. The academic council has the power to review and recommend the curricular offerings and rules of discipline of the university subject for appropriate action of the Board of Regents. Among the 162 members of the Council, 83 are females (51%) and 79 are males (49%).

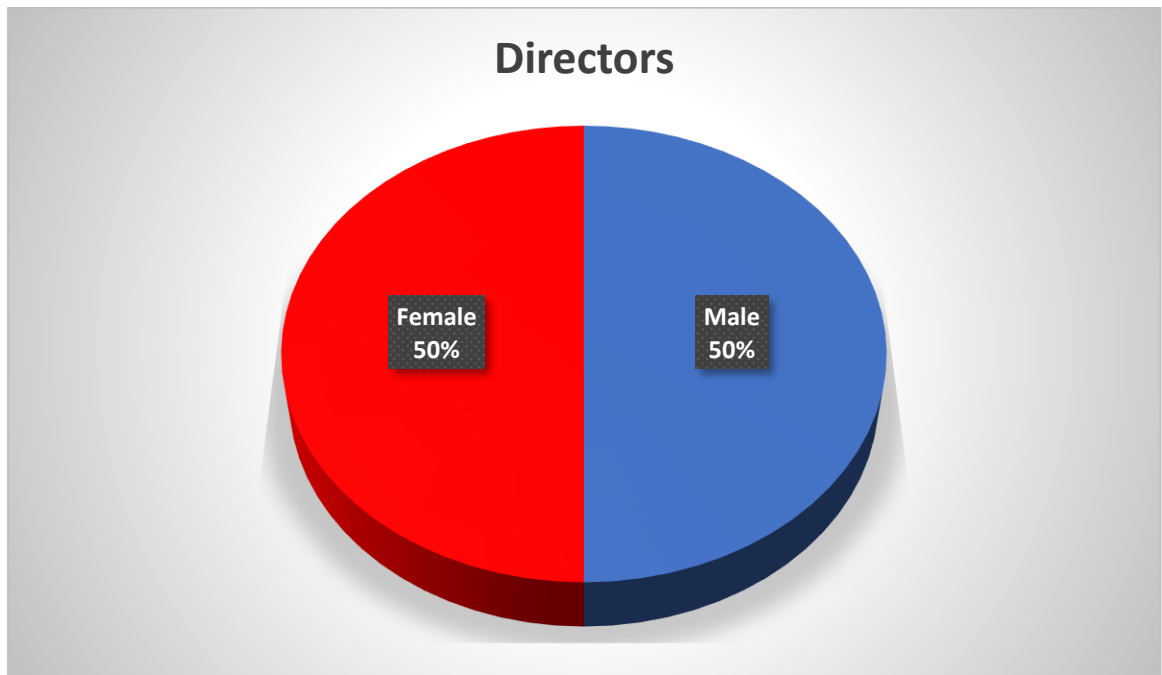

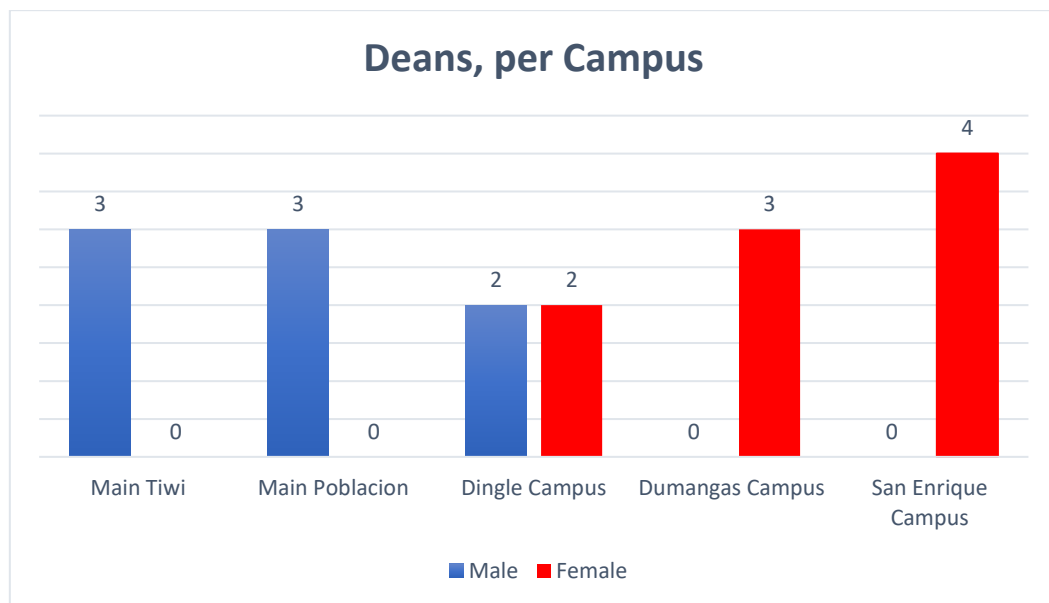
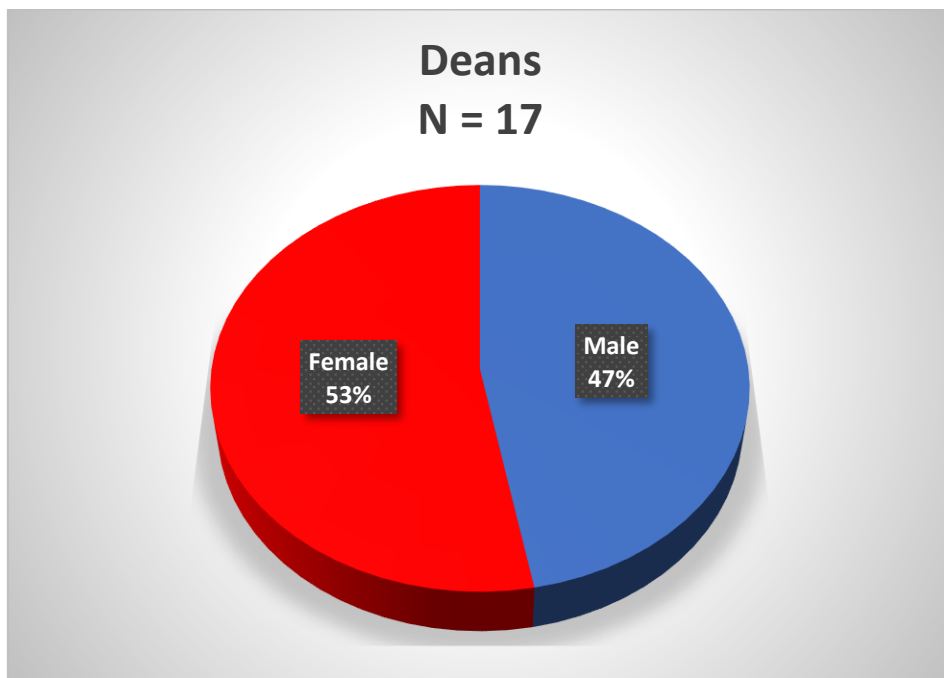
DIRECTORS

The men and women are equally represented among the directors of the University. Out of the 22 Directors, there are 11 women directors (50%) and 11 men directors (50%).



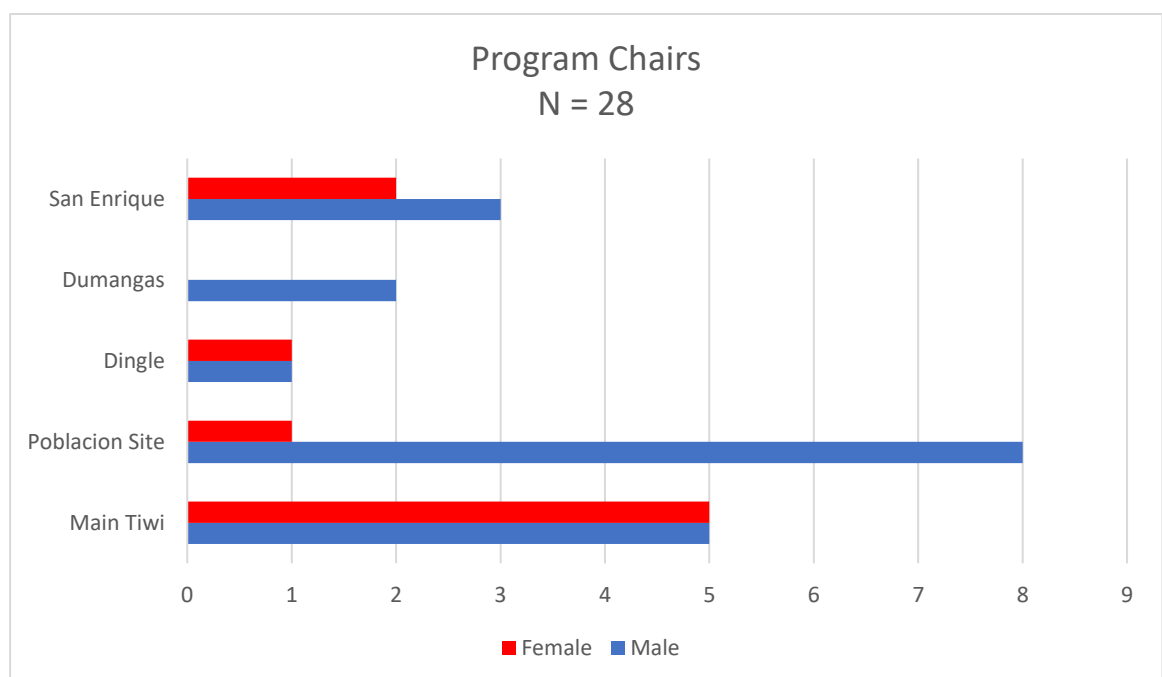
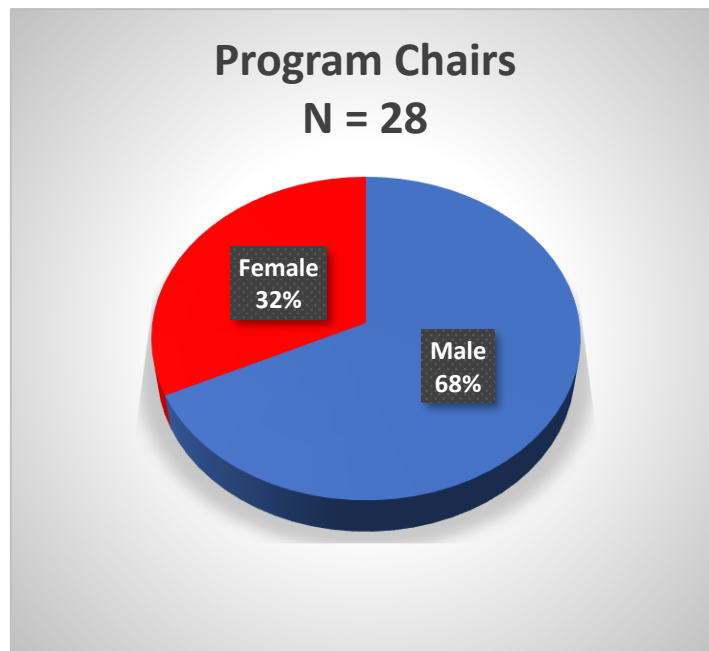
DEANS

Of the 17 Deans, 9 are women (53%) while 8 are men (47%). All Deans in Dumangas Campus and San Enrique Campus are women. On the other hand, Deans from Main Tiwi Campus and Main Poblacion Campus are all men. Deans in Dingle Campus are equally represented.



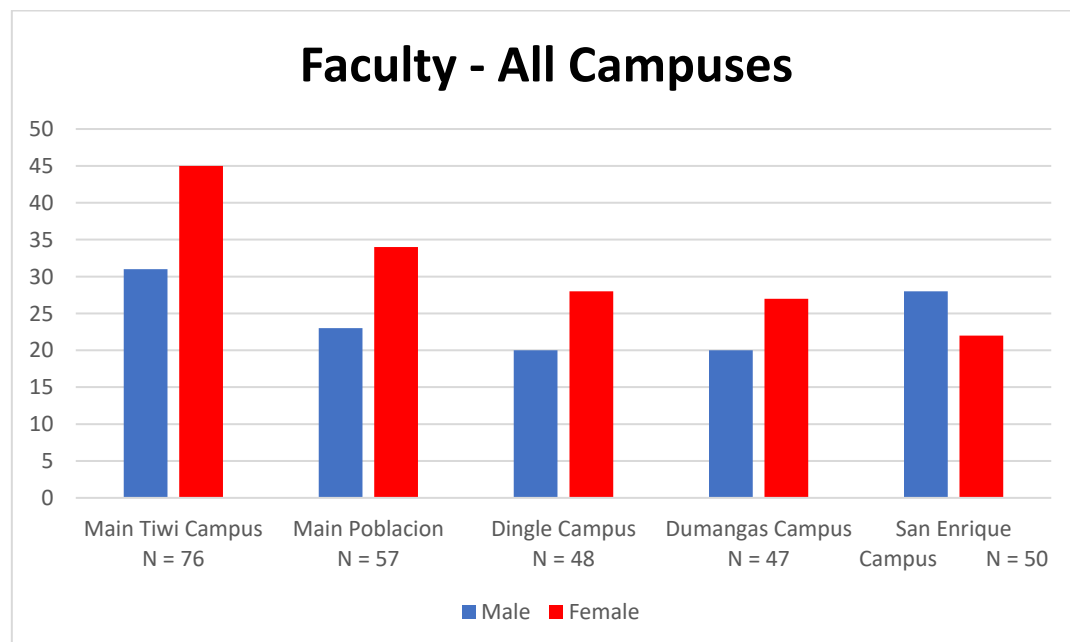
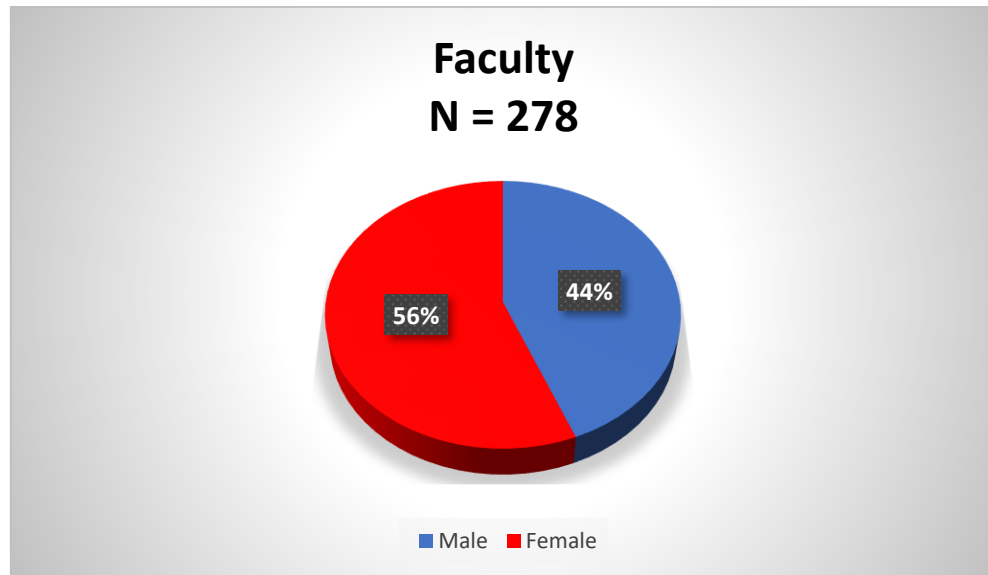
PROGRAM CHAIRS

There are 28 program chairs handling the different programs offered by the University. It includes program chairs for both undergraduate and graduate programs. From this population, 19 are males (68%) and 9 are females (32%).



FACULTY

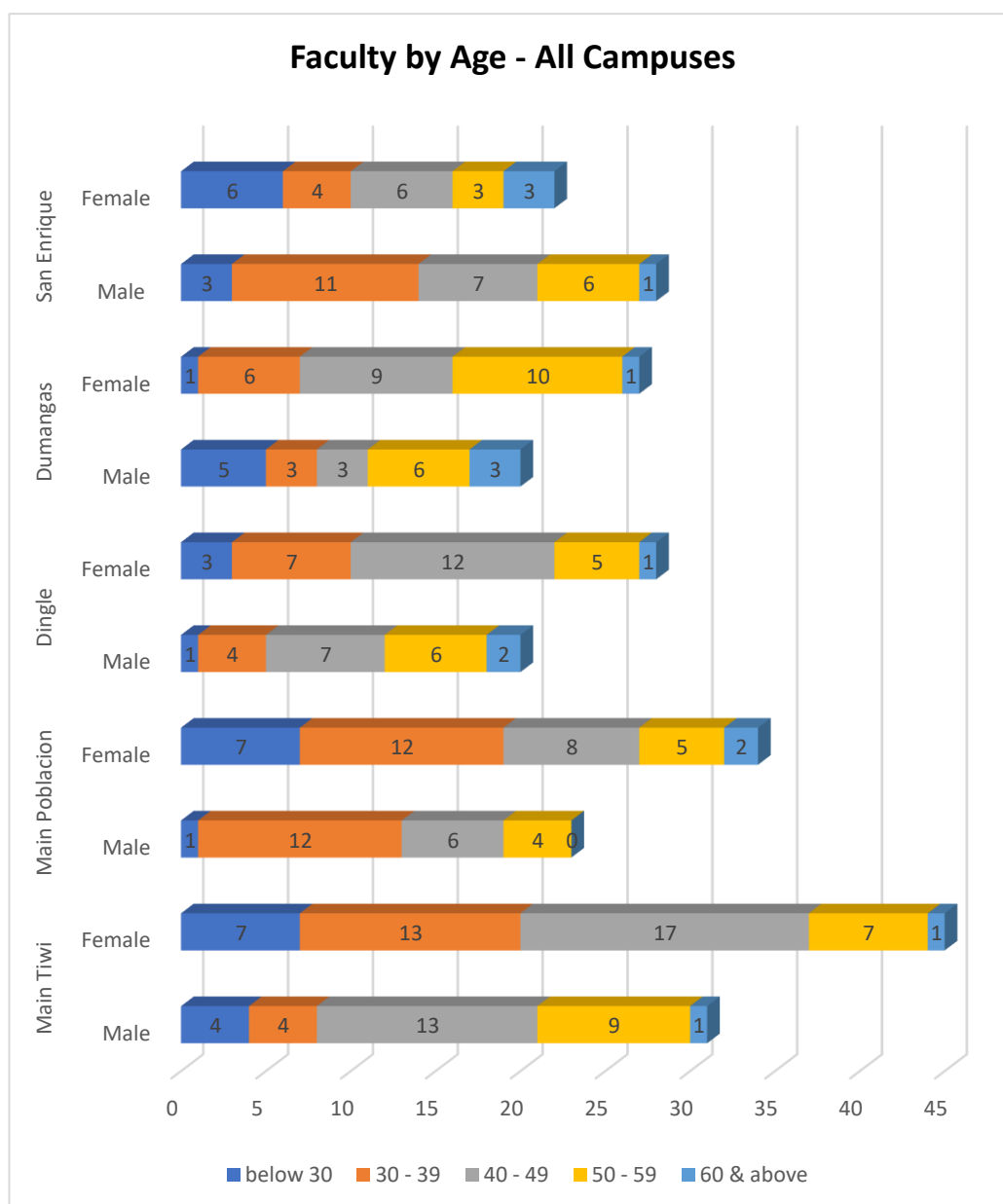
There are 278 members of the faculty in the five campuses of the University. Out of this number, 156 are females and 122 are males.

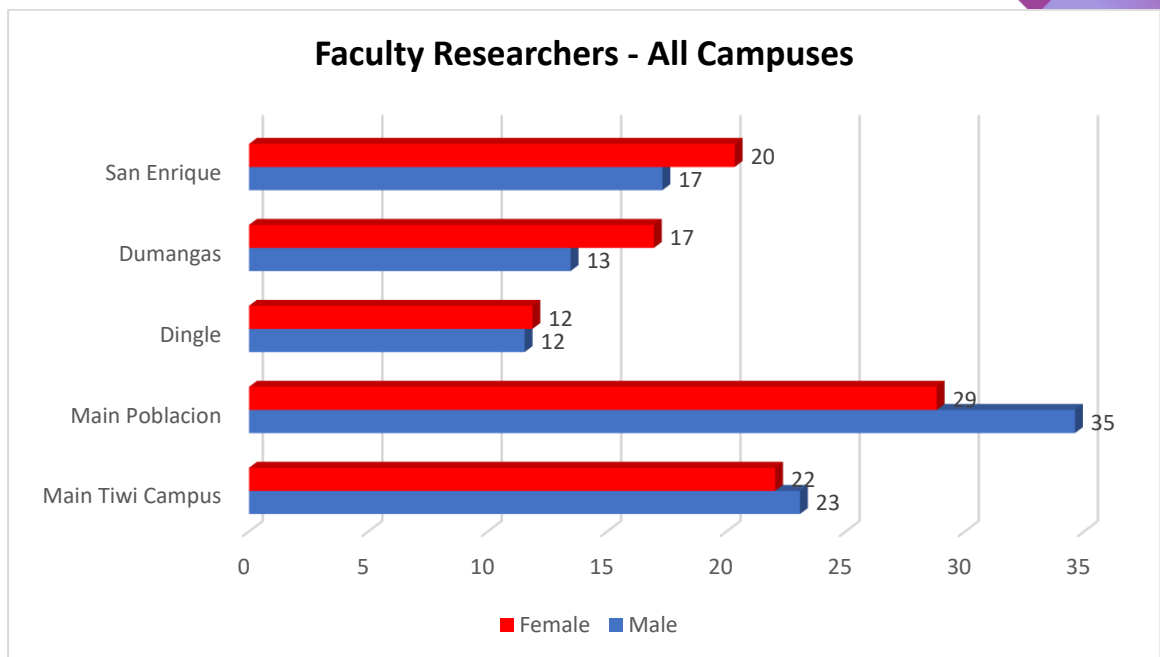

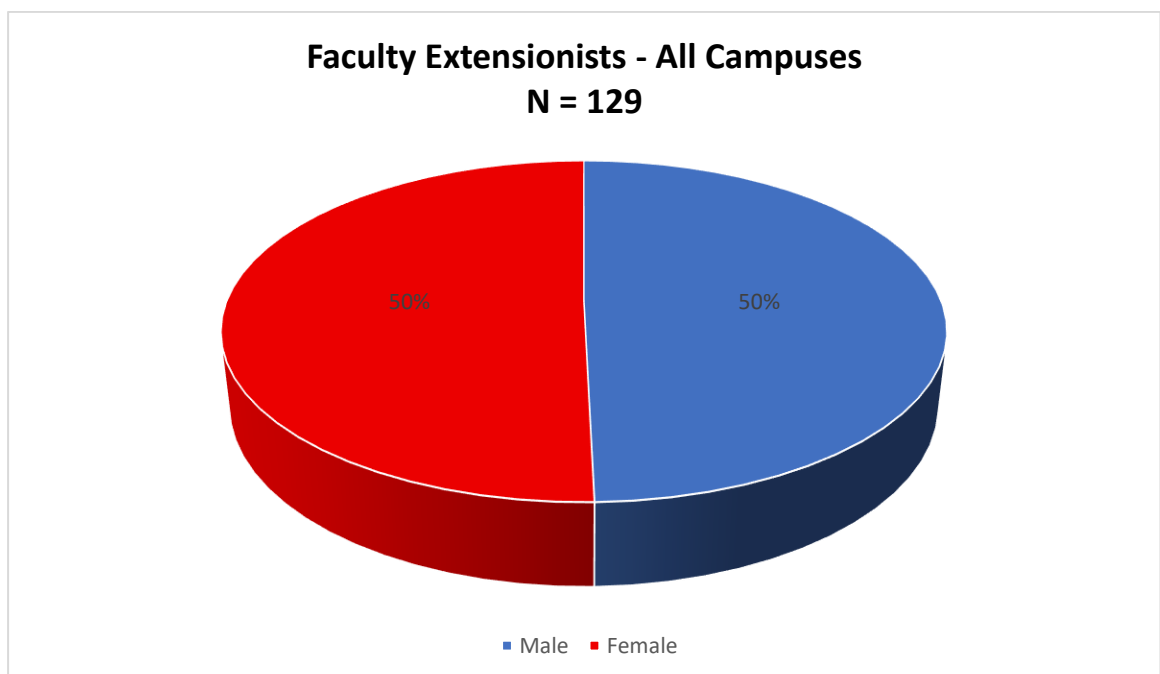
There was a total of 111 faculty researchers in the five campuses of the University. Of this data, 59 were female researchers (53%) while 52 were male researchers (47%).

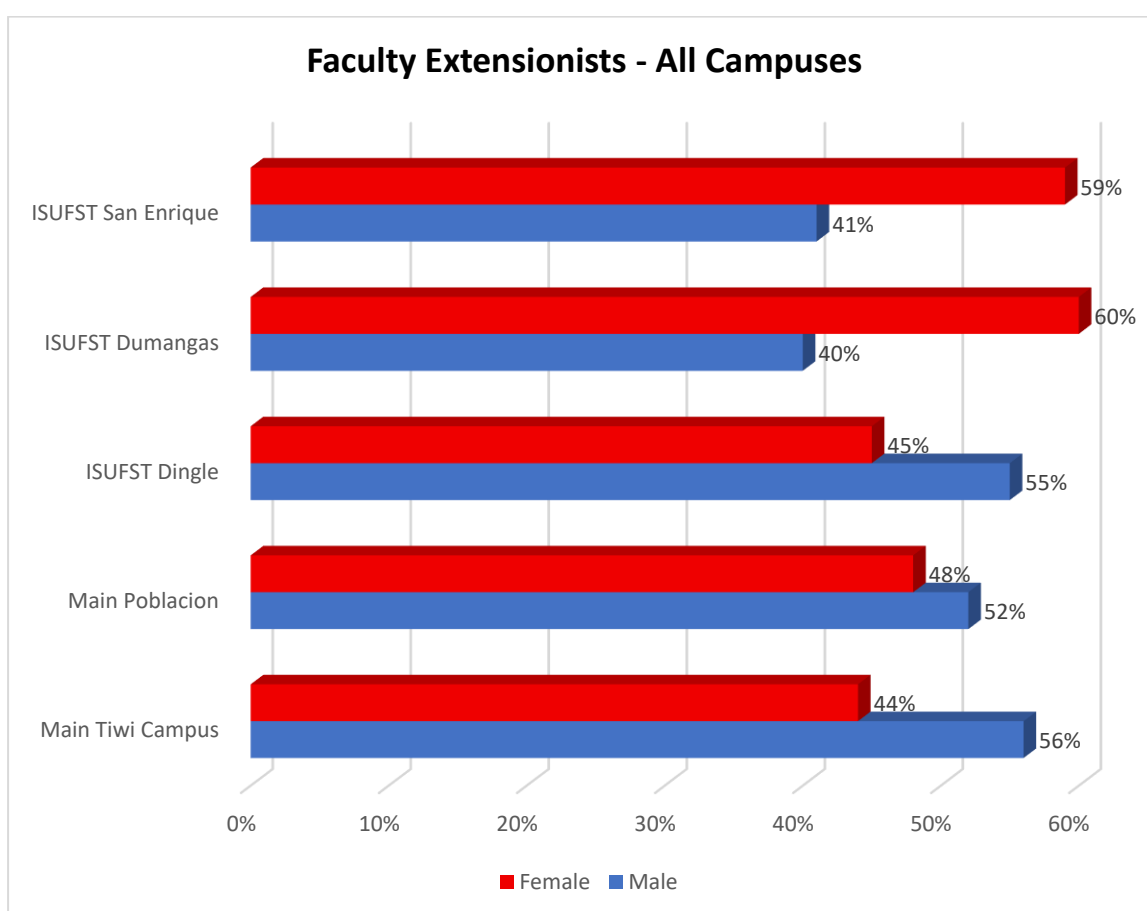

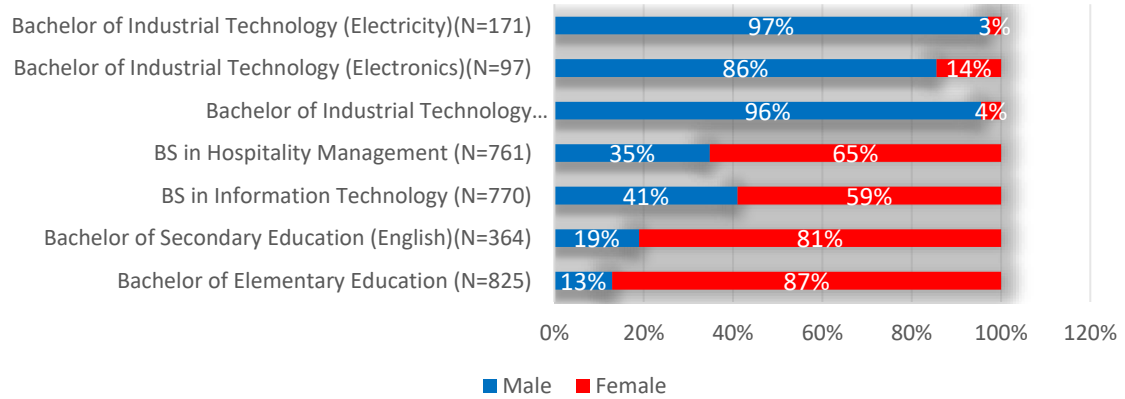
MAIN CAMPUS - POOBLACION SITE



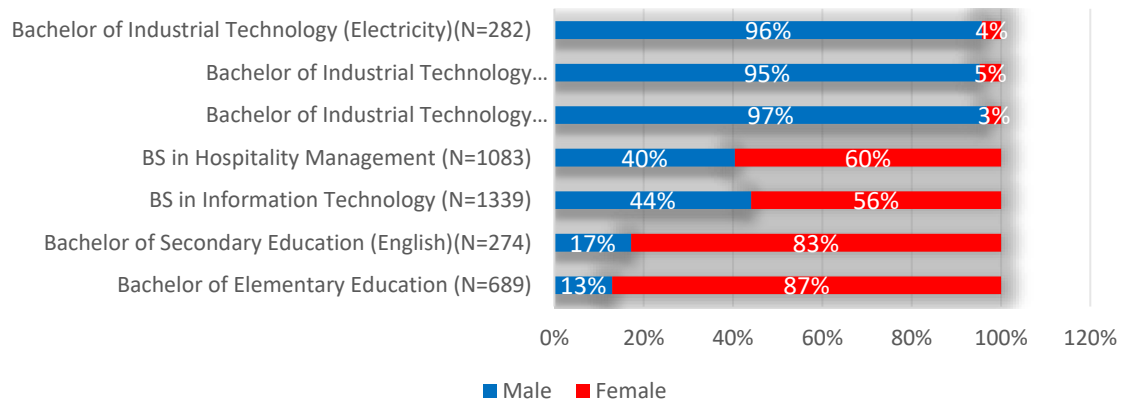
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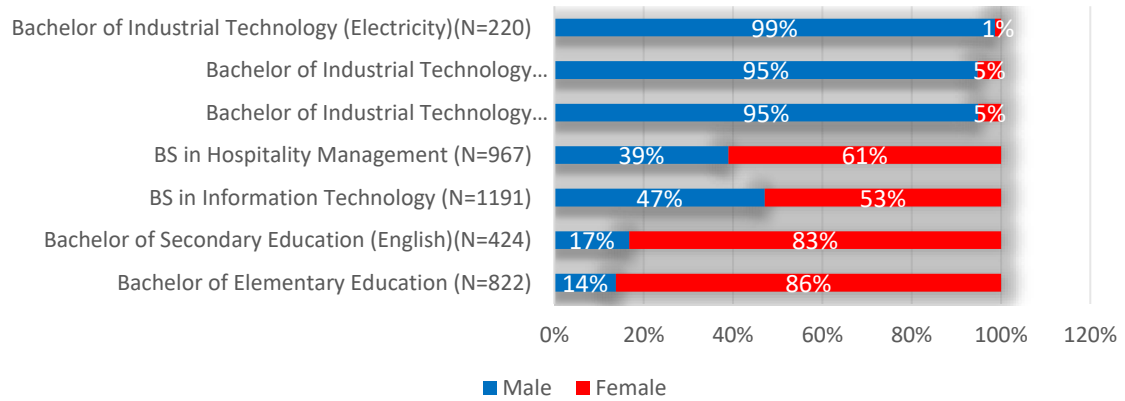
